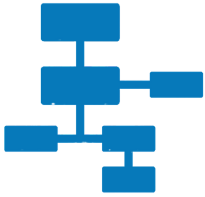


## MEETING YOUR NEEDS DURING UNCERTAIN TIMES



# COVID-19 RELATED CONTACT TRACING

Everyone from the Director of the CDC, Robert Redfield to Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, Anthony Fauci to a host of Governors from across the United States agree that in order to open up the American economy, **one critical element is the deployment of contact tracing.**

This is an intensely **people focused activity** that will require, by some recent estimates, up to 300,000 tracers. The function is labor intensive, requires investigatory skills and a commitment to eliciting information, follow through and compliance in order to be effect and there is very little time to dedicate to training a large cadre of tracers.

### National Resources

SCIS has over **17,000 employees deployed across the country** who are already trained and vetted in similar functions and working under federal standards for safeguarding the public. These resources, specifically a large number of **investigators, inspectors and trainer/quality control monitors** could be available to support this need on a national basis.

This is clearly a national issue that must be resolved in a broad based manner in order to be effective. While the federal government has not taken up a primary role in addressing this issue, regional groups of States are beginning to allocate funding, find financial supporters (such as Michael Bloomberg) and engage in an implementation strategy. The biggest challenge now is locating sufficient trained and capable personnel to execute. SCIS has personnel distributed across the country and is capable of **immediately supporting** this initiative.
